





Topic: Discussion and Consideration of Compatibility of Land Purchase with Comprehensive Plan (Planning Commission) and Resolution Considering Possible Land Acquisition (City Council)

Proposed By: Citizen (Landowner)

Description: The city was approached by a landowner who has lots for sale within an area that is surrounded by city property. There appears to be three (3) lots in the area owned by private parties, two (2) of the lots are owned by a husband/wife. The lots have been used by the city (storage of materials). One of the landowners approached the city and is asking if the city council is interested in acquiring these two (2) lots.

The County Estimated Market Value for each lot is \$2,700 (2024). The landowner has offered them at the price of \$3,000 each (\$6,000). They are also asking the city to provide all closing costs, estimated by staff at another \$2,000.

Recommendation by Staff: Take action as desired. The Planning Commission should review for compatibility with Comprehensive Plan and A DRAFT Resolution is attached if the City Council would like to proceed.

Other Options: Take no action, table action, or let the owners know the city is not interested at this time.

Legal Issues: The City Council has the authority to acquire land for numerous city purposes. If the City Council would like to go forward, and the Planning Commission has concurred, a Resolution is attached with the following conditions and/or findings:

- The City Council has reviewed the price and found it to be fair and compatible with the County Estimated Market Value. (\$6,000 plus closing/attorney costs)
- 2) The property is attached to or surrounded by other city owned property and can be used or combined by the city for present and future uses.
- 3) The Planning Commission and City Council finds that the property is compatible with the Comprehensive Plan and there are no Comprehensive Plan restrictions, conditions or requirements.
- 4) The City Clerk is authorized to proceed forward with the purchase if the following conditions are met:

- a) The City Attorney will draft a Purchase Agreement and send it to the property owners for approval.
- b) Once the Purchase Agreement is completed and approved by all parties, the City Attorney or their designee will undertake a successful title search to ensure proper ownership of the lots, that no taxes are owed (or will be paid before the sale is completed), that there are no liens against the property, and that the city will have clear title to the property.
- c) The City Attorney will undertake and complete the closing on the property.

Financial Impact: \$6,000 (lots) + \$2,000 (estimated legal cost) for a total estimated cost of \$8,000 to acquire these two lots. The city has funds in the amount of \$34,000 available in their Future City Development Fund that could be used for this purchase if the City Council so desires.

462.356 PROCEDURE TO EFFECT PLAN: GENERALLY.

Subdivision 1. **Recommendations for plan execution.** Upon the recommendation by the planning agency of the comprehensive municipal plan or sections thereof, the planning agency shall study and propose to the governing body reasonable and practicable means for putting the plan or section of the plan into effect. Subject to the limitations of the following sections, such means include, but are not limited to, zoning regulations, regulations for the subdivision of land, an official map, a program for coordination of the normal public improvements and services of the municipality, urban renewal and a capital improvements program.

Subd. 2. Compliance with plan. After a comprehensive municipal plan or section thereof has been recommended by the planning agency and a copy filed with the governing body, no publicly owned interest in real property within the municipality shall be acquired or disposed of, nor shall any capital improvement be authorized by the municipality or special district or agency thereof or any other political subdivision having jurisdiction within the municipality until after the planning agency has reviewed the proposed acquisition, disposal, or capital improvement and reported in writing to the governing body or other special district or agency or political subdivision concerned, its findings as to compliance of the proposed acquisition, disposal or improvement with the comprehensive municipal plan. Failure of the planning agency to report on the proposal within 45 days after such a reference, or such other period as may be designated by the governing body shall be deemed to have satisfied the requirements of this subdivision. The governing body may, by resolution adopted by two-thirds vote dispense with the requirements of this subdivision when in its judgment it finds that the proposed acquisition or disposal of real property or capital improvement has no relationship to the comprehensive municipal plan.

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412.211 GENERAL STATUTORY CITY POWERS.

Every city shall be a municipal corporation having the powers and rights and being subject to the duties of municipal corporations at common law. Each shall have perpetual succession, may sue and be sued, may use a corporate seal, may acquire, either within or without its corporate limits, such real and personal property as the purposes of the city may require, by purchase, gift, devise, condemnation, lease or otherwise, and may hold, manage, control, sell, convey, lease, or otherwise dispose of such property as its interests require. The powers listed in this act are not exclusive and other provisions of law granting additional powers to cities or to classes of cities shall apply except where inconsistent with this chapter.

13D.05 MEETINGS HAVING DATA CLASSIFIED AS NOT PUBLIC.

Subdivision 1. **General principles.** (a) Except as provided in this chapter, meetings may not be closed to discuss data that are not public data.

- (b) Data that are not public data may be discussed at a meeting subject to this chapter without liability or penalty, if the disclosure relates to a matter within the scope of the public body's authority and is reasonably necessary to conduct the business or agenda item before the public body.
- (c) Data discussed at an open meeting retain the data's original classification; however, a record of the meeting, regardless of form, shall be public.
- (d) All closed meetings, except those closed as permitted by the attorney-client privilege, must be electronically recorded at the expense of the public body. Unless otherwise provided by law, the recordings must be preserved for at least three years after the date of the meeting.
- Subd. 2. When meeting must be closed. (a) Any portion of a meeting must be closed if expressly required by other law or if the following types of data are discussed:
- (1) data that would identify alleged victims or reporters of criminal sexual conduct, domestic abuse, or maltreatment of minors or vulnerable adults;
- (2) active investigative data as defined in section 13.82, subdivision 7, or internal affairs data relating to allegations of law enforcement personnel misconduct collected or created by a state agency, statewide system, or political subdivision;
- (3) educational data, health data, medical data, welfare data, or mental health data that are not public data under section 13.32, 13.3805, subdivision 1, 13.384, or 13.46, subdivision 2 or 7; or
 - (4) an individual's medical records governed by sections 144.291 to 144.298.
- (b) A public body shall close one or more meetings for preliminary consideration of allegations or charges against an individual subject to its authority. If the members conclude that discipline of any nature may be warranted as a result of those specific charges or allegations, further meetings or hearings relating to those specific charges or allegations held after that conclusion is reached must be open. A meeting must also be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.
- Subd. 3. What meetings may be closed. (a) A public body may close a meeting to evaluate the performance of an individual who is subject to its authority. The public body shall identify the individual to be evaluated prior to closing a meeting. At its next open meeting, the public body shall summarize its conclusions regarding the evaluation. A meeting must be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.
- (b) Meetings may be closed if the closure is expressly authorized by statute or permitted by the attorney-client privilege.
 - (c) A public body may close a meeting:
 - (1) to determine the asking price for real or personal property to be sold by the government entity;
 - (2) to review confidential or protected nonpublic appraisal data under section 13.44, subdivision 3; and
 - (3) to develop or consider offers or counteroffers for the purchase or sale of real or personal property.

Before holding a closed meeting under this paragraph, the public body must identify on the record the particular real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting. The proceedings of a meeting closed under this paragraph must be tape recorded at the expense of the public body. The recording must be preserved for eight years after the date of the meeting and made available to the public after all real or personal property discussed at the meeting has been purchased or sold or the governing body has abandoned the purchase or sale. The real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting must be specifically identified on the tape. A list of members and all other persons present at the closed meeting must be made available to the public after the closed meeting. If an action is brought claiming that public business other than discussions allowed under this paragraph was transacted at a closed meeting held under this paragraph during the time when the tape is not available to the public, section 13D.03, subdivision 3, applies.

An agreement reached that is based on an offer considered at a closed meeting is contingent on approval of the public body at an open meeting. The actual purchase or sale must be approved at an open meeting after the notice period required by statute or the governing body's internal procedures, and the purchase price or sale price is public data.

(d) Meetings may be closed to receive security briefings and reports, to discuss issues related to security systems, to discuss emergency response procedures and to discuss security deficiencies in or recommendations regarding public services, infrastructure and facilities, if disclosure of the information discussed would pose a danger to public safety or compromise security procedures or responses. Financial issues related to security matters must be discussed and all related financial decisions must be made at an open meeting. Before closing a meeting under this paragraph, the public body, in describing the subject to be discussed, must refer to the facilities, systems, procedures, services, or infrastructures to be considered during the closed meeting. A closed meeting must be tape recorded at the expense of the governing body, and the recording must be preserved for at least four years.



Purchase and Sale of Real Property

Understand the statutory authority of cities to acquire and dispose of real estate, including by sales, purchases, and alternatives such as gifts, leases, dedication, contract for deed, lease-purchase and others. Be alert to common issues in transactions such as environmental considerations, deed restrictions, trust land, permissions to buy and sell, and more.

I. Acquisition of land

All statutory cities have authority to acquire real estate for various purposes. These cities may acquire real property either within or outside their corporate limits. Statutory cities may acquire real estate in any of the following ways:

- Purchase. A city can acquire the title to land by simply buying it.
- Gifts of land. A city can accept gifts of land.
- Dedication. A city can require developers to dedicate land for parks, streets, and utility purposes as a condition of subdivision approval.
- Devise. A city may receive real estate by bequest in a will.
- Eminent domain (condemnation). This is a required sale of land to a government entity for public use or public purpose.
- Tax-Forfeiture. A city may acquire tax-forfeited land through outright purchase for the land's appraised value or may acquire the land at no cost if the city agrees to use the land for a public purpose.

Most often cities acquire real estate through an outright purchase of all the rights and title to a specific parcel. This type of purchase is known as a purchase of fee simple rights and is represented by a deed document. However, cities can also acquire other types of interest in land using:

- Contract for deed. A city can purchase real property using a contract for deed if certain conditions are met.
- Lease-purchase. A city can rent real estate with the option to buy.
- Leases. A city can acquire an interest in real estate through rental agreements.
- Easements. A city may acquire easements over property for such things as streets and utilities. Sometimes these easements are acquired by purchase or condemnation; other times the owner of the property may give them to a city.

When a city acquires tax-forfeited property at no cost, the use of the land will be restricted to specific public purposes specified in the deed document for a specified period of time. When a city ceases to use the land for the specified purposes, the land may revert to the state of Minnesota.

Home rule charter cities may have special requirements in their charters related to the acquisition of real property. These cities should check their charters for additional restrictions that may apply to them. If a charter is silent in this area, the city may follow the same rules that apply to statutory cities.

A. Purchase

Statutory cities have the power to purchase real property within or outside of their corporate limits. Home rule charter cities generally have similar authority in their charters.

A city may have a responsibility to pay relocation costs to persons who are displaced from their homes, farms, or businesses as a result of the purchase. Relocation costs may be required apply even when the eminent domain process is not used to acquire a parcel. In recognition of the need to provide relocation benefits, most cities include a waiver in the final contract indicating whether these costs have been included in the price or if the sale is a negotiated one.

If a city is developing an offer or counteroffer to purchase real property, it may close a meeting to discuss the offer or counteroffer.

B. Gifts of land to cities

Any city may accept a grant or devise of real property and maintain such property for the benefit of its citizens in accordance with the terms prescribed by the donor. In order to accept a gift of real property a city council must adopt a resolution by two-thirds majority of the entire council accepting the property and any recognizing any terms of the acceptance.

Before accepting a grant of land, a city should carefully consider whether it can comply with any conditions of the grant. For example, a city could not agree to use the property for religious or sectarian purposes. Additionally, a city should investigate the history of the land to ensure it is not contaminated before accepting such a gift.

The Minnesota Supreme Court has held that the language in a deed that donating property to a city and limiting the use to municipal or park purposes automatically expired 30 years after the date of the conveyance.

2. Land values

The value of real estate is not always obvious. When considering a land purchase, a city may want to check the following:

- The property's value for the most recent property tax levy.
- The property's value for the most recent special assessment.
- The value that the land and its buildings (if any) are insured for fire damage, etc.
- Any recent occurrences that could affect the land's value, such as new neighboring land developments or contamination.

In addition to considering these elements, a city should also have the land professionally appraised. (Section IV of this memo discusses appraisers).

F. Tax Forfeiture

Land held by private parties may be forfeited to the state due to failure to pay property taxes. When this occurs, state law recognizes that some lands in public ownership should be retained for the benefit of the public while other lands should be returned to private ownership. Reflecting this understanding, tax-forfeited land is classified in two ways – either as conservation land or non-conservation land when it is obtained by the state.

1. Land classified as non-conservation land

Cities may obtain tax-forfeited land classified as non-conservation land in two ways. Cities may:

- Pay the appraised value of the land and receive full, clear title to the land.
- Receive the land for free for certain specified uses with an agreement that the lands may only be used for a specified public use for a certain amount of time.

Cities may obtain land for free land designated as non-conservation land for the following specified uses:

- a road, or right-of-way for a road.
- a park that is both available to, and accessible by, the public that contains amenities such as campgrounds, playgrounds, athletic fields, trails, or shelters.
- trails for walking, bicycling, snowmobiling, or other recreational purposes, along with a reasonable amount of surrounding land maintained in its natural state.





A RESOLUTION ADOPTING MODIFIED CONDITIONS FOR EXISTING FINAL PLAT (APPLICATION NUMBER 09-3327) FROM 2009 ON BEHALF OF NORTHERN LIGHTS OVER ROOSEVELT HOMEOWNER'S ASSOCIATION

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2024 the Emily City Council reviewed an application to modify the original conditions for an existing final plat (application number 09-3327) that regulated the docking storage location and parking on the West side of State Highway 6 on behalf of: Northern Lights Over Roosevelt Homeowner's Association, on the following property:

Legal Description: Northern Lights Over Roosevelt Plat

Section 9- Township 138 -Range 26.

And.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has considered the applicant's request at a duly noticed Public Hearing which took place on May 7, 2024, and has recommended approval to the City Council; and,

Original Findings of Fact:

- 1. The applicant has complied with the conditions of the preliminary plat approval.
 - a. the applicant has submitted an exhibit of passive recreation facilities. the planning commission has accepted the drawing and its implementation has been included in the development agreement.
 - b. section 3.1, subpart e of the declarations indicates that all trails and walkways shall be constructed of wood chips or similar material.
 - c. section 3.1, subpart f of the declarations establishes the 50-foot vegetative buffer in outlot a and prohibits the clearing of live trees or brush in this buffer.
 - d. section 3.1, subpart g of the declarations prohibits vegetation removal in outlot a as pr the preliminary plat.
 - e. section 3.1, subpart h of the declarations restricts impacts to the ice ridge.
 - f. the applicant has submitted a plan for development on the west side of highway 6. the planning commission has accepted the plan.
 - g. section 2.12 of the declarations restrict the use of docking areas on roosevelt lake to lot owners.
 - h. section 2.12 of the declarations indicate that docks are to be removed annually.
 - i. section 2.12 of the declarations provides a mechanism agreeable to the planning commission for allocating rights to the mooring slips.
 - j. the applicant has prepared a stormwater pollution prevention plan. the plan has been reviewed and accepted by the planning commission.
 - k. the applicant has submitted a road plan that has been reviewed by the city engineer. the engineer's concerns have been resolved.
 - I. the portion of smokey hollow road that is owned by the applicant is being dedicated to the public as part of the subdivision.

- m. section 7.5 of the association documents limit the impervious coverage for each lot to that of the underlying zoning district.
- n. the swimming area and boardwalk have been eliminated from the submitted plans.
- o. section 2.12 of the declarations indicates that docks and lifts are to be stored off site or east of highway 6.
- p. section 2.12 of the declarations limits the number of boat slips to 16 and requires the establishment of a key card system.
- q. section 2.12 of the declarations requires the establishment of a no wake zone around the docking facility.
- r. section 2.12 of the declarations prohibits all recreational facilities on the west side of highway 6, with the exception of the 16 mooring slips.
- s. section 2.12 calls for property owners purchasing a mooring slip to receive information regarding best practices for safely crossing the highway.
- t. the applicant has coordinated improvements with mn/dot, which is requiring a \$10,000 security deposit to ensure the improvements are completed.
- u. crooked lake township has indicated that smokey hollow road is to have aggregate surfacing material added by the developer within the existing road section.
- v. section xx of the development agreement indicates that nothing will be burned in the preparation of the lots.
- 2. The final plat is in agreement with the approved preliminary plat.
- 3. The city attorney has completed review of the title work and found it to be acceptable.
- 4. There are no public improvements required on the property. the only public improvements are to highway 6, which are being handled by mn/dot.
- 5. A plat check by an independent land surveyor has been completed.
- 6. A financial security of \$5,000 will be provided for security on the construction of the lights and the erection of signs in the drop off area.

Original Conditions with Modifications as highlighted:

- 1) To augment the existing submittals, the applicant shall provide an exhibit of passive recreation facilities within the development. This exhibit shall include the trails and shoreline recreation facilities submitted in previous drawings. Once this drawing has been accepted by the Planning Commission, the improvements shown will be used during the preparation of the development agreement.
- 2) Trails and walkways shall be constructed of wood chips or similar material so as to not increase the runoff from the trail surface.
- 3) The association documents will provide for a 50-foot vegetative buffer in Outlot A as depicted on the preliminary plat. Clearing of live trees or brush within this buffer shall be prohibited.

4) The association documents shall indicate that all buffers within Outlot A and lying between Highway 6 and Smokey Hollow Road will be maintained in their natural condition with no vegetative removal except for trails and forest management purposes. No clear cutting will be allowed.

5) The historic ice ridges shall not be damaged or diminished during the development process or in subsequent use of the property. This requirement, as well as the importance of the ice ridge in maintaining water quality, shall be clearly stated within the association documents.

6) The applicant shall submit a detailed plan for the improvements to the west

side of Highway 6. Specifically identified must be:

a. Clearing limits,

- b. Approach locations,
- c. Wetland buffer areas,
- d. Docking facilities, and
- e. Mechanisms for erosion control during construction.

 The plan shall be in a form acceptable to the Planning Commission prior to application for final plat.
- 7) Association documents shall restrict the use of the docking areas on Roosevelt Lake solely for the use of lot owners.
- 8) Association documents shall reflect that all docks are to be seasonal (not permanent) and thus must be removed annually.
- 9) OMIT
- 10)Association documents shall provide a mechanism, agreeable to the Planning Commission, for allocating rights to the mooring slips.
- 11) The applicant shall prepare and provide to the City a stormwater pollution prevention plan for the entire development that is acceptable to the Planning Commission.
- 12)Roads within the subdivision shall be built to minimum City standards, but can remain privately maintained. Approvals from the Road Committee are required.
- 13) That portion of Smokey Hollow Road that lies within this development and is 33-feet south of the centerline of the roadway shall be dedicated to the public, if a 66-foot corridor is not already dedicated for this roadway.
- 14) Association documents shall indicate that the impervious coverage allowed on each lot shall be limited to the impervious coverage limitation of the underlying zoning district.
- 15) Eliminate the swimming area and the boardwalk from the plan.
- 16) Docks and lifts shall be allowed to be stored on-site on the shoreline and walking path each year with efforts made to store the docks out of clear view from the lake.
- 17) Lifts shall be professionally removed by the Association Owners and moved for storage to their place of residence in the development at Northern Lights Over Roosevelt Lake Association.
- 18) The number of boat slips will be limited to 16. To further control access to the docking facility, a lock or key-card system will be established to provide access to only those that have purchased one of the slips.
- 19)A no wake zone shall be established around the proposed docking facility.

20)All proposed recreational facilities on the west side of Highway 6, except for the 16 mooring slips, are prohibited.

21) Property owners that purchase mooring slips shall receive information

regarding best practices for safely crossing the highway.

22) The City will require that the developer continue to coordinate with Mn/DOT and that Mn/DOT's recommendations be implemented, including:

- a. The north approach/drop off area will be allowed as outlined by MnDOT in their letters dated April 3, 2024 and April 19, 2024, attached as Exhibit A.
- b. A northbound right turn lane and a southbound bypass lane must be constructed on TH 6 at the Smokey Hollow Road intersection.

c. Lighting and signs shall be installed as per Mn/DOT guidance.

- d. Roadway and safety appurtenances will be installed as per Mn/DOT guidance.
- e. Drainage patterns need to be perpetuated and erosion/ sediment controlled. A drainage plan must be submitted to Mn/DOT for review.

f. No drainage ponds will be allowed in the right of way.

- g. There will be no net increase in development drainage to the highway right of way.
- h. Proposed development signs must be located outside of the right of way.

i. No fences of structures are allowed in the right of way.

j. No excavation or grade changes are allowed in the right of way.

k. All Mn/DOT permits must be obtained.

- 23) Day parking for ATVs, UTVs, and golf carts shall be allowed 42 feet from the nearest white line on State Highway 6.
- 24) Drop off and pickup shall be allowed with motorized vehicles only.

25) No day parking shall be allowed for automobiles and trucks.

- 26)All costs of compliance with Mn/DOT conditions shall be paid for by the developer.
- 27) The City of Emily will require, subject to acceptance by Crooked Lake Township within 90 days of preliminary plat approval, that the developer improve Smokey Hollow Road to Crooked Lake Township's standards up to the second entrance to the development. If Crooked Lake Township does not accept the improvements, no improvements to Smokey Hollow Road will be required.
- 28) The developer shall not burn anything related to its construction activities in preparing the platted lots for sale, including such things as the construction of the roads, parks, trails, and clearing of potential home sites by the Developer. The Developer, however, may haul, chip or bury it.

29) The shoreline is to remain in its natural state. No clearing allowed.

30) Efforts shall be made to limit water flow down the walking path to avoid runoff and erosion.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EMILY, MINNESOTA AS FOLLOWS:

The application to modify the original conditions of the existing Northern Lights Over Roosevelt Final Plat to regulate the docking storage location and parking on the West side of State Highway 6 is hereby approved, subject to the above listed conditions.

We received your letter dated October 3, 2023. I apologize for the slow response regarding the property owners request to modify the original conditions of the permit. We brought the request to our Development Review Committee. The items discussed included are as follows:

Access from the plat – MnDOT feels there should be a trail access to TH 6 from the development. This would improve the walkability to the lake from the development. This would include building an 8' to 10' wide access across the ditch. The ditch in this area is part of the ATV trail and is continually in disrepair with ruts and standing water, and not always in the best shape for walking across. This access would provide a safer and more visible crossing to both the traveling motorists and ATV's. MnDOT will be placing pedestrian crossing ahead signs in advance of the crossing. We will not be allowing a designated painted crosswalk due to the high speeds on this rural segment.

Parking/Drop Off Area — The old road will continue to be allowed to be used for loading/unloading with no long-term parking allowed. No real estate signing will be allowed on MnDOT Right of Way, all existing signs should be removed.

Dock Storage - The dock and lifts will be allowed to be placed along the shoreline of the lake for winter storage.





§ 90.33 ROAD VACATION PROCEDURE.

- (A) The following procedure shall be followed for all petitions for vacation of streets, alleys, public grounds, public ways, plats and/or auditor's subdivisions located with the city.
 - (1) Vacation by city.
- (a) The City Council may, by resolution, vacate any street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof upon its own motion after a four-fifths vote of all members of the City Council.
- (b) The City Council shall not vacate any such street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof, unless it appears in the interest of the public following a hearing preceded by two weeks' published and posted notice.
- (c) 1. The Council shall cause written notice of the hearing, at least ten days before the hearing, to be mailed to:
 - a. Each property owner whose property abuts the area sought to be vacated;
- b. Those persons who own property within the plat, if the area sought to be vacated is located within a plat; and
 - c. All property owners within 350 feet of the area sought to be vacated.
- 2. The notice must contain, at a minimum, a copy of the proposed resolution as well as the time, place and date of hearing.
- (d) If the street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof terminates at or abuts upon any public water, no vacation shall be made, unless written notice of the proposed resolution is served by certified mail upon the Commissioner of Natural Resources at least 30 days before the hearing on the matter. The notice to the Commissioner of Natural Resources is for notification purposes only and does not create a right of intervention by the Commissioner.
- (e) If, following a hearing, the Council adopts a resolution vacating a street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof, the Clerk/Treasurer shall prepare a notice of completion of the proceedings, which shall contain the name of the city and identification of the vacation, a statement of the time of completion thereof and a description of the real estate and lands affected thereby. The notice shall be presented to the county's Auditor, who shall enter the same in the transfer records and note upon the instrument, over official signature, the words "entered in the transfer record". The notice shall then be filed with the county's Recorder. Any failure to file the notice shall not invalidate any such vacation proceedings.
 - (2) Vacation by petition.
- (a) A majority of the owners of land, on a front footage basis, abutting a street, alley, public ground, public way or part thereof may submit a petition to vacate such street, alley, public ground, public way or part thereof.
- (b) A petition to vacate shall be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee as set forth in the Fee Schedule Ordinance on file in the city offices. The applicant shall file the petition and required application fee with the City Clerk/Treasurer, who shall schedule the matter for hearing before the City Council.
- (c) The applicant shall provide a list of the property owners to be affected by the proposed vacation along with a current mailing address for each such property owner. The applicant shall provide the city with mailing labels containing the name and address of the property owners to be affected, which mailing labels are available at the County Auditor's office. The property owners to be affected includes:

- 1. Each property owner whose property abuts the area sought to be vacated;
- 2. Those persons who own property within the plat; and
- 3. All property owners within 350 feet of the area sought to be vacated.
- (d) 1. The city shall cause written notice of the hearing to be mailed to each property owner affected by the proposed vacation, identified by the applicant as provided in division (A)(2)(b) above, at least ten days before the hearing before the City Council. Property owners to be affected includes:
 - a. Each property owner whose property abuts the area sought to be vacated;
- b. Those persons who own property within the plat, if the area sought to be vacated is located within a plat; and
 - c. All property owners within 350 feet of the area sought to be vacated.
- 2. The notice must contain, at a minimum, a copy of the proposed resolution as well as the time, place and date of hearing.
- (e) The City Council may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the members of the Council, adopt a resolution vacating a street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof if it appears in the interest of the public to be necessary following a hearing proceeded by two weeks' published and posted notice.
- (f) If the street, alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof terminates at or abuts upon any public water, no vacation shall be made, unless written notice of the proposed resolution is served by certified mail upon the Commissioner of Natural Resources at least 60 days before the hearing on the matter. The notice to the Commissioner of Natural Resources is for notification purposes only and does not create a right of intervention by the Commissioner.
- (g) If, following a hearing, the Council adopts a resolution vacating a street alley, public ground, public way or any part thereof, the Clerk/Treasurer shall prepare a notice of completion of the proceedings, which shall contain the name of the city and identification of the vacation, a statement of the time of completion thereof and a description of the real estate and lands affected thereby. The notice shall be presented to the county's Auditor, who shall enter the same in the transfer records and note upon the instrument over official signature, the words "entered in the transfer record". The notice shall then be filed with the county's Recorder. Any failure to file the notice shall not invalidate any such vacation proceedings.
- (B) With respect to streets or alleys connecting separate plats or lines between blocks or lots or providing access for the public to any public water, the Council shall not vacate any such street or alleyway, unless it appear that the street or alleyway or part thereof sought to be vacated is useless for the purpose for which it was laid out.
- (C) All decisions by the City Council in granting or denying petitions to vacate shall be final, except that any aggrieved person or persons, or any department, board or commission of the jurisdiction of the state, shall have the right to appeal within 30 days after the City Council makes its decision to the county's District Court on questions of law and fact.

ROAD VACATION REQUIREMENTS:

×	City responsibility related to a dedicated public street may not be given up through any procedure other than a formal, lawful vacation. MN Statute establishes that the Council may vacate a street only upon finding that the vacation is "in the interest of the public". The public must benefit, in some manner, from the vacation.
	Majority of property owners abutting a street to be vacated (including both spouses) submit a petition. Nonrefundable payment of \$2,000 required with petition.
	Property owner provides mailing labels. If property owner is in a plat, all property owners in the plat must be notified. If the property owner is in an unplatted area, the affected area must be defined.

1. Starting a street vacation

There are two methods for commencing a vacation. A city council, on its own motion, may start the vacation process. A resolution for a vacation commenced by a city council must be adopted by a four-fifths vote of all council members.

In the alternative, a majority of landowners abutting a street to be vacated may initiate a vacation by petition. The language of the statute related to vacation by petition, is permissive and a city council is not required to vacate a street simply because a valid petition is received. The decision to act on a petition is a discretionary act of the council.

Once a city receives a vacation petition, the city must confirm that the petition sufficiently complies with the statutory requirements. Specifically, the city must confirm that the petition has been signed by the correct number of abutting property owners.

a. When is a property considered to abut a proposed vacation?

A property owner is considered to "abut," a street if the property owner's land is touching, reaching, joining, bordering on, or contiguous with the street to be vacated.

b. What constitutes a majority of abutting landowners?

The requirement that a "majority of owners of land" sign the petition means that a majority of individuals having property interests in the land abutting the street to be vacated must sign the petition. This requirement does not mean owners representing a majority of the abutting properties. For example, if there are four property owners abutting a street to be vacated, three must sign the petition. In this scenario, it would not matter if one of the four owners owned 90 percent of the land abutting the street. Despite the substantial property interest of one of the abutting owners (representing a majority of abutting property on the street), three property owners must still sign the petition.

Married persons often own property as "joint tenants" or as "tenants in common." Normally, a joint tenancy creates two property interests. A tenancy in common may create two or more property interests. These interests are counted separately as owners for the purposes of determining the number of abutting landowners. For example, on a street with four abutting properties, each held by two persons as joint tenants, the number of ownership interests is eight (even though there are only four properties). The signatures needed to constitute a majority of abutting owners on this street would be five.

When validating a petition, a city will typically review property records of all the properties abutting the street to determine the number of owners involved. This is typically determined by looking at the property deeds. The number of property owners on those deeds is the number used to determine if the petition is sufficient.

c. What constitutes an ownership interest in abutting land?

An ownership interest in land does not include mere easement interests and implicates actual fee ownership. While easement holders may not sign a petition for vacation as abutting property owners, the city should carefully consider the concerns of easement holders—particularly easement holders with water, sewer, and electrical lines—prior to granting a vacation.

d. Is a city with property abutting a vacation considered an "owner of land" for the purposes of signing the petition?

A city that has a fee ownership interest in land abutting a street to be vacated may choose to join in signing a petition for vacation.

2. Public hearing and notice requirements

Whether initiated by the council or by petition from the abutting owners, the city must conduct a public hearing to solicit public input on a proposed vacation prior to granting a vacation.

a. Notice requirements

Notice of the hearing must be published in the city's legal newspaper and posted at least two weeks prior to the hearing. Newspaper publication must be once a week for two weeks. In addition, written notice of the hearing must be mailed to each property owner affected by the proposed vacation at least 10 days before the hearing. The notice must contain, at minimum, a copy of the petition or proposed resolution as well as the time, place, and date of the hearing. Sending the notice by certified mail is not required by the statute.

Unfortunately, the statute does not define who is considered to be an "affected" property owner entitled to notice. The implications of the term "affected" are broader than the term "abutting" used elsewhere in the statute. As a result, the group of "affected" owners comprises a group larger than the abutting owners, but smaller than the general citizenry of the city who will receive published notice of the vacation.

B. AWARD OF DAMAGES FOR OTHER ITEMS

The City Council finds that additional "damages" as defined by Minn. Stat. § 435.37 either have been or will be incurred, including but not limited to the City's attorney fees, the time and expenses for the council, clerk, and other staff related to these proceedings, appraisal and engineering fees, and filing and recording costs. Some of these damages have been incurred, and others will not be incurred until a future date. The final amount of these damages will be ascertained when these proceedings are completed, and an itemization of the same will be given to Petitioners.

The damages either have been or will be deducted from the amount previously deposited with the City.

If the actual damages of all kinds (including the award to the affected landowners) prove to be less than amount on deposit, any excess in the deposit will be returned to Petitioners. If said actual damages exceed the amount of the deposit, the City will so notify Petitioners, and Petitioners shall deposit any necessary additional amount to cover the excess prior opening the cartway or any further proceedings herein.

The City Clerk shall keep an account of all expenses and all amounts paid from said deposit, and

shall provide to Petitioners upon request a reasonable accounting of the same. If Petitioners disagree or disputes any amounts deducted from the deposit, Petitioners and the City Council shall meet to discuss the same, and reasonably attempt to resolve any such disputes.

APPEAL

Pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 164.07, which contains the procedures which the City Council of Emily is to follow in cartway proceedings, any owner or occupant may appeal from the award of damages by filing a notice of appeal with the Crow Wing County Court Administrator. However, the owner or occupant must file the notice of appeal within 10 days of the filing of the award of damages in order to delay the opening, construction, alteration, change, or other improvements in or to the cartway. The notice of appeal shall be accompanied by a bond of not less than \$250.00, with sufficient surety approved by the judge or county auditor conditioned to pay all costs arising from the appeal in case the award is sustained. A copy of the notice of appeal shall be mailed by registered or certified mail to the city clerk or any member of the city council. The notice of appeal shall specify the award of failure to award appealed from, the land to which it relates, the nature and amount of the claim of appellant, and the grounds of the appeal, which may include a challenge to the public purpose of necessity of the proposed road or cartway.





Small Cities Assistance Program

Program Overview

The Small Cities Assistance Program was created in 2015 to provide funding for construction and maintenance of roadways in cities with a population less than 5,000. Minnesota Statute 162.145 provides details on the program. The program is administered by MnDOT's State Aid for Local Transportation Division with the funding distributed by the Minnesota Department of Revenue.



Program Guidance and Criteria

Guidance

Eligible local agencies include cities that do not receive municipal state aid under Statutes 162.09 to 162.14. This primarily includes all cities that have a population of 5,000 or less.

The Commissioner of Revenue distributes the funds to cities in the same manner as local government aid under chapter 477A. Generally, cities will receive 50 percent of the payment around July 26 and 50 percent of the payment around December 26.

In each city's bank account, these funds may show up as "Intergovernmental Transfer" or something similar. However, in looking at the payment information in SWIFT, the name of the aid is shown in two places: the customer account field will reflect SML_CT_ASSIST and the message field will reflect SMALL CITY ASSIST. If there are any questions on this, the SWIFT Helpline can be reached at 651-201-8106.

Criteria

The preliminary aid to each city is calculated as follows:

- 5 percent equally allocated to all cities
- 35 percent allocated based on each city's share of lane miles of municipal streets compared to the total municipal lane miles of all eligible cities
- 35 percent allocated based on each city's share of population compared to the total population of all eligible cities
- 25 percent allocated based on each city's share of the state aid adjustment factor compared to the sum of the state aid adjustment factor for all eligible cities
 - The state aid adjustment factor is the greater of zero or:

- 0.005 minus
- The number of lane miles of county state aid highway in a city compared to the total lane miles of county state aid highways in eligible cities

The final aid to each city is the lesser of:

- The preliminary aid or
- The maximum aid, which equals 3.5 multiplied by the unweighted average amount of assistance to a city in a year.

Use of Funds

The funding is for the construction and maintenance of roads located within the city and can include land acquisition, environmental analysis, design, engineering, construction, reconstruction, and maintenance.

Timeline for Use of Funds

There is no specified timeline by when the cities need to use these funds. However, it is recommended that they be used within two years of receiving the initial payment.

Accounting of Funds

The cities are not required to submit a report on how the funds were expended. Each city is required to follow appropriate accounting practices to clearly show that the funds they received have been used on the eligible items listed above and in the statute. One recommendation is to establish a separate account for these funds and then reduce that account as eligible expenditures are incurred.

Bill Would Provide One-Time Funding for Small Cities Assistance Program

April 8, 2024

The proposed legislation would provide \$25 million to be distributed this July to cities with populations below 5,000 for street maintenance, repairs, and reconstruction.

A League-supported bill, <u>SF 4899/HF 4872</u>, was laid over for inclusion in omnibus funding packages in the <u>Senate Transportation Committee</u> and the <u>House Transportation Finance and Policy Committee</u>. Authored by <u>Sen. John Jasinski</u> (R-Faribault) and <u>Rep. Jeff Brand</u> (DFL-St. Peter), the measure would help cities with populations below 5,000 pay for street maintenance, repairs, and reconstruction.

The measure is necessary due to a delay in new revenues that will flow to small cities from the <u>Transportation Advancement Account</u> (TAA) that was created in 2023. The effective date of the retail delivery fee combined with the relatively slow phase-in of the dedication of the auto parts sales tax, which fund the account, means there will not be meaningful TAA funds available until fiscal year 2026 (beginning July 1, 2025).

If enacted, the \$25 million in funds would be distributed to small cities on a formula basis in July 2024. Omnibus transportation bills have not yet been assembled, but the League will advocate that Small Cities Assistance Program funds be included in the package in both the House and Senate.

AN INTERIM ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A STUDY AND IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE OPERATION OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES (CULTIVATION, PROCESSING, AND DISTRIBUTION) IN THE CITY OF EMILY

The City Council of the City of Emily, Crow Wing County, State of Minnesota does hereby ordain:

I. Findings of Fact.

A prohibition on the operation of Cannabis Businesses is necessary to ensure that the City has sufficient time to study potential regulations that will protect the health and safety of the residents of Emily.

- A. The Minnesota Legislature enacted, and the Governor signed, 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63-H.F. No. 100 ("Act"), which is comprehensive legislation relating to Cannabis including, but not limited to, the establishment of the Office of Cannabis Management ("OCM"), legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products for adults, providing for licensing, inspection, and regulation of Cannabis Businesses and hemp businesses; taxing the sale of cannabis flower, cannabis products, and certain hemp products, and amending criminal penalties.
- B. The Act provides local units of government certain authority related to Cannabis Businesses, which does not include lower potency hemp edible manufacturers and retailers, including the authority to (1) require local registration of certain Cannabis Businesses operating retail establishments, (2) adopt reasonable restriction on time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, provided that such restrictions do not prohibit the establishment or operation of Cannabis Businesses, (3) limit the number of certain Cannabis Businesses based on population of the community, and (4) prohibit the operation of a Cannabis Business within 1,000 feet of a school, or 500 feet of a daycare, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic fields.
- C. The Act directs the OCM to establish additional rules and regulations relating to the operation of Cannabis Businesses. The City will benefit from reviewing and analyzing the OCM's model ordinances, rules and regulations before making any decisions related to the operation of Cannabis Businesses in the City.
- D. Section 342.13 established by the Act contains provision that allows for a City Council that plans to conduct studies or is considering adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a Cannabis Business, to

- hold a hearing on and adopt an interim ordinance for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens until January 1, 2025.
- E. Minnesota Legislature adopted the Conference Committee Report on HF 4757. HF 4757 requires the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) to begin accepting applications for social equity applicants on July 24, 2024, with applications closing on August 12, 2024. A successful social equity applicant will gain preapproval to operate a cannabis business. HF 4757 allows businesses that have received preapproval to immediately begin cultivating cannabis if the business complies with local zoning ordinances, complies with state fire and building codes, and complies with Minnesota rules related to medical cannabis.
- F. Given the uncertainty regarding the model ordinance to be developed by the OCM and the broad scope of the changes to Minnesota law brought about by the Act, the City desires to adopt an interim ordinance for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and to conduct a study for the purpose of considering the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place and the manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses (cultivation, processing, and distribution) as well as the other regulations local units of government may adopt under the Act.

II. Definitions.

- A. Cannabis Cultivation: Means any activity involving the planting, growing, harvesting, drying, curing, grading, or trimming of cannabis plants, cannabis flower, hemp plants, or hemp plant parts.
- B. Cannabis Processing: Refers to any method used to prepare cannabis or its byproducts for commercial retail and/or wholesale, including but not limited to: drying, cleaning, curing, packaging, and extraction of active ingredients to create cannabis related products and concentrates.
- C. Cannabis Retail Sale/Distribution: Means any licensed person or entity that purchases or otherwise obtains usable cannabis from cannabis cultivators, processors or manufacturers, and sells these from a retail store, but excludes the sale of cannabis for exclusively medical purposes where that sale is made in accordance with federal or State medical cannabis or medical marihuana enactments and regulations.

III. Scope.

The City Council hereby authorizes and directs the Planning Commission to consider the proper regulations to be put in place regarding reasonable restrictions on the time, place and the manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses (cultivation, processing, and distribution) within the City. The Planning Commission will then make a recommendation to the City Council about whether the City should amend its zoning, business-licensing, or other general Code provisions related to the manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses to better protect the residents of Emily.

V. Moratorium.

In accordance with the findings set forth herein, a moratorium is established as follows:

- A. No business, person or entity may operate a Cannabis Business (cultivate, process, or distribute cannabis) for a period up to December 31, 2024, or until the Council repeals this Ordinance, whichever occurs first.
- B. During the term of this Ordinance, the City staff will not issue any license or permit, nor will it accept or process any applications for uses related to the operation of Cannabis Businesses (cultivation, processing, or distribution).
- C. The moratorium established by this Ordinance does not apply to the sale, testing, manufacturing, or distribution of THC products.
- D. The moratorium established by this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and shall remain effective until December 31, 2024, unless further amended by order of this City Council.

V. Enforcement.

Any person, firm, entity, partnership, or corporation who violates any provisions of this Interim Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor as defined by state law and subject to a fine or imprisonment in jail for a period not to exceed 90 days, or both, and in either case, costs of prosecution. Alternatively, the City may enforce violations of this Interim Ordinance through civil remedies. In all cases where the City is enforcing compliance with this Interim Ordinance and the enforcement does not involve criminal prosecution, the offending party shall be required to reimburse the City for the City's attorney's fees and costs associated with enforcing the offending party's compliance with this Interim Ordinance.

VI. Validity.

The validity of any word, sentence, section, clause, paragraph, part or provision of this Interim Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of this Interim Ordinance which can

Conference Committee Report on H.F. No. 4757:

Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 342.13, is amended to read:

342.13 LOCAL CONTROL.

- (a) A local unit of government may not prohibit the possession, transportation, or use of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles, or hemp-derived consumer products authorized under this chapter.
- (b) Except as provided in section 342.22, a local unit of government may not prohibit the establishment or operation of a cannabis business or hemp business licensed under this chapter.
- (c) A local unit of government may adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a cannabis business provided that such restrictions do not prohibit the establishment or operation of cannabis businesses. A local unit of government may prohibit the operation of a cannabis business within 1,000 feet of a school, or 500 feet of a day care, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field.
- (d) The office shall work with local units of government to:
- (1) develop model ordinances for reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a cannabis business;
- (2) develop standardized forms and procedures for the issuance of a retail registration pursuant to section 342.22; and
- (3) develop model policies and procedures for the performance of compliance checks required under section 342.22.
- (e) If a local unit of government is conducting studies or has authorized a study to be conducted or has held or has scheduled a hearing for the purpose of considering adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a cannabis business, the governing body of the local unit of government may adopt an interim ordinance applicable to all or part of its jurisdiction for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens. Before adopting the interim ordinance, the governing body must hold a public hearing. The interim ordinance may regulate, restrict, or prohibit the operation of a cannabis business within the jurisdiction or a portion thereof until January 1, 2025.
- (f) Within 30 days of receiving a copy of an application from the office, a local unit of government shall certify on a form provided by the office whether a proposed cannabis business complies with local zoning ordinances and, if applicable, whether the proposed business complies with the state fire code and building code. The office may not issue a license if a the local unit of government informs the office that the cannabis business does not meet local zoning and land use laws. If the local unit of government does not provide

the certification to the office within 30 days of receiving a copy of an application from the office, the office may issue a license.

- (g) Upon receipt of an application for a license issued under this chapter, the office shall contact the local unit of government in which the business would be located and provide the local unit of government with 30 days in which to provide input on the application. The local unit of government may provide the office with any additional information it believes is relevant to the office's decision on whether to issue a license, including but not limited to identifying concerns about the proposed location of a cannabis business or sharing public information about an applicant.
- (h) (g) The office by rule shall establish an expedited complaint process to receive, review, and respond to complaints made by a local unit of government about a cannabis business. Complaints may include alleged violations of local ordinances or other alleged violations. At a minimum, the expedited complaint process shall require the office to provide an initial response to the complaint within seven days and perform any necessary inspections within 30 days. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a local unit of government from enforcing a local ordinance. If a local unit of government notifies the office that a cannabis business other than a cannabis retailer, cannabis microbusiness or cannabis mezzobusiness with a retail operations endorsement, cannabis mezzobusiness, lower-potency hemp edible retailer, medical cannabis retailer, or medical cannabis combination business operating a retail location poses an immediate threat to the health or safety of the public, the office must respond within one business day and may take any action described in section 342.19 or 342.21.
- (i) (h) A local government unit that issues <u>a cannabis</u> retailer registration under section 342.22 may, by ordinance, limit the number of licensed cannabis retailers, cannabis mezzobusinesses with a retail operations endorsement, and cannabis microbusinesses with a retail operations endorsement to no fewer than one registration for every 12,500 residents.
- (j) (i) If a county has one active registration for every 12,500 residents, a city or town within the county is not obligated to register a cannabis business.
- (k) (j) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a local government unit from allowing licensed cannabis retailers in excess of the minimums set in paragraph (i) (h).
- (l) (k) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, the state shall not issue a license to any cannabis business to operate in Indian country, as defined in United States Code, title 18, section 1151, of a Minnesota Tribal government without the consent of the Tribal government.

EFFECTIVE DATE.

This section is effective the day following final enactment.

The Cannabis Licensing Process

An applicant will take the following steps to proceed from application to active licensure. As described, processes vary depending on social equity status and/or whether the type of license being sought is capped or uncapped in the general licensing process.

License Preapproval: Early Mover Process for Social Equity Applicants

The license preapproval process is a one-time application process available for verified social equity applicants. State law requires OCM to open the application window on July 24, 2024, and close the window on August 12, 2024. The preapproval process is available for the following license types, and all are capped in this process: microbusiness, mezzobusiness, cultivator, retailer, wholesaler, transporter, testing facility, and delivery service.

Preapproval steps:

- 1 Applicant's social equity applicant (SEA) status verified.
- 2. Complete application and submit application fees.
- 3. Application vetted for minimum requirements by OCM.
- 4. Application (if qualified) entered into lottery drawing.
- 5. If selected in lottery, OCM completes background check of selected applicant and issues license preapproval.
- 6. Applicant with license preapproval* submits business location and amends application accordingly.
- 7. OCM forwards completed application to local government.
- 8. Local government completes certification of zoning compliance.
- 9. OCM conducts site inspection.
- 10. When regulations are adopted, license becomes active, operations may commence.

*For social equity applicants with license preapproval for microbusiness, mezzobusiness, or a cultivator license, they may begin growing cannabis plants prior to the adoption of rules if OCM receives approval from local governments in a form and manner determined by the office. This is only applicable to cultivation and does not authorize retail sales or other endorsed activities of the licenses prior to the adoption of rules.

Zoning and Land Use

Buffer Guidelines (342.13)

State law does not restrict how a local government conducts its zoning designations for cannabis businesses, except that they may prohibit the operation of a cannabis business within 1,000 feet of a school, or 500 feet of a day care, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including playgrounds and athletic fields.

Zoning Guidelines

While each locality conducts its zoning differently, a few themes have emerged across the country. For example, cannabis manufacturing facilities are often placed in industrial zones, while cannabis retailers are typically found in commercial/retail zones. Cannabis retail facilities align with general retail establishments and are prohibited from allowing consumption or use onsite, and are also required to have plans to prevent the visibility of cannabis and hemp-derived products to individuals outside the retail location. Industrial hemp is an agricultural product, and should be zoned as such.

Cannabis businesses should be zoned under existing zoning ordinances in accordance with the license type or endorsed activities held by the cannabis business. Note that certain types of licenses may be able to perform multiple activities which may have different zoning analogues. In the same way municipalities may zone a microbrewery that predominately sells directly to onsite consumers differently than a microbrewery that sells packaged beer to retailers and restaurants, so too might a municipality wish to zone two microbusinesses based on the actual activities that each business is undertaking. Table 1, included on Pages 13 and 14, explains the types of activities that cannabis businesses might undertake, as well as, some recommended existing zoning categories.

Local Approval Process (cont.)

Local Retail Registration Process (342.22)

Once the licensing process begins, local government registration applies to cannabis retailers or other cannabis/hemp businesses seeking a retail endorsement. Local governments must issue a retail registration after verifying that:

- The business has a valid license or license preapproval issued by OCM.
- The business has paid a registration fee or renewal fee to the local government;
 - Initial registration fees collected by a local government may be \$500 or half the amount of the applicable initial license fee, whichever is less, and renewal registration fees may be \$1,000 or half the amount of the applicable renewal license fee, whichever is less.
- The business is found to be in compliance with Chapter 342 and local ordinances.
- If applicable, the business is current on all property taxes and assessments for the proposed retail location.

Local registrations may also be issued by counties if the respective local government transfers such authorities to the county.

Determining a Process for Limiting Retail Registrations

If a local government wishes to place a limitation on the number of retailers and microbusiness/mezzobusinesses with retail endorsements allowed within their locality (as long as there is at least one retail location per 12,500 residents, see Page 10), state law does not define the process for a local government's selection if there are more applicants than registrations available. A few options for this process include the use of a lottery, a first-come/first-serve model, a rolling basis, and others. Local governments should work with an attorney to determine their specific process for selection if they wish to limit the number of licensed cannabis retailers per 342.13. Local governments are not required to limit the number of licensed cannabis retailers.

Local Approval Process (cont.)

Local governments are permitted specific authorities for registration refusal and registration suspension, in addition to—and not in conflict with—OCM authorities.

Registration and Renewal Refusals

Local governments may refuse the registration and/or certification of a license renewal if the license is associated with an individual or business who no longer holds a valid license, has failed to pay the local registration or renewal fee, or has been found in noncompliance in connection with a preliminary or renewal compliance check.



Local Registration Suspension (342.22)

Local governments may suspend the local retail registration of a cannabis business or hemp business if the business is determined to not be operating in compliance with a local ordinance authorized by 342.13 or if the operation of the business poses an immediate threat to the health and safety of the public. The local government must immediately notify OCM of the suspension if it occurs. OCM will review the suspension and may reinstate the registration or take enforcement action.

Expedited Complaint Process (342.13)

Per state law, OCM will establish an expedited complaint process during the rulemaking process to receive, review, read, and respond to complaints made by a local unit of government about a cannabis business. Upon promulgation of rules, OCM will publish the complaint process.

At a minimum, the expedited complaint process shall require the office to provide an initial response to the complaint within seven days and perform any necessary inspections within 30 days. Within this process, if a local government notifies OCM that a cannabis business poses an immediate threat to the health or safety of the public, the office must respond within one business day.

Creating Your Local Ordinance

As authorized in 342.13, a local government may adopt a local ordinance regarding cannabis businesses. Establishing local governments' ordinances on cannabis businesses in a timely manner is critical for the ability for local cities or towns to establish local control as described in the law, and is necessary for the success of the statewide industry and the ability of local governments to protect public health and safety. The cannabis market's potential to create jobs, generate revenue, and contribute to economic development at the local and state level is supported through local ordinance work. The issuance of local certifications and registrations to prospective cannabis businesses is also dependent on local ordinances.

- Local governments may not prohibit the possession, transportation, or use of cannabis, or the establishment or operation of a cannabis business licensed under state law.
- Local governments may adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of cannabis business operations (see Page 11).
- Local governments may adopt interim ordinances to protect public safety and welfare, as any studies and/or further considerations on local cannabis activities are being conducted, until January 1, 2025. A public hearing must be held prior to adoption of an interim ordinance.
- If your local government wishes to operate a municipal cannabis store, the establishment and operation of such a facility must be considered in a local ordinance.

The purpose of this Interim Ordinance is to impose a Moratorium on the operation of Cannabis businesses (cultivation, processing and distribution) and to authorize a study for the purpose of considering the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place and the manner of the operation of Cannabis businesses (cultivation, processing and distribution) as well as the other regulations local units of government may adopt under the 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63-H.F. No. 100 ("Act") and as amended by Conference Committee Report on H.F. No. 4757 for the City of Emily, County of Crow Wing, State of Minnesota.

The City Council determines that publication of the title and a summary of this ordinance will clearly inform the public of the intent and effect of the ordinance and the Council has approved the text of this summary and has directed that the title and a summary be published pursuant to Minnesota Statute § 412.191 Subd. 4.

ORDINANCE NO 2024-04 CITY OF EMILY COUNTY OF CROW WING STATE OF MINNESOTA

AN ORDINANCE TO REVISE THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF EMILY WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT

- 33.20 Repeal: Emily City Code, Chapter 33 Public Safety, Fire Department Section, Subsections 33.20 through 33.31, and Volunteer First Response Unit Section, Subsections 33.45 through 33.53, adopted on January 9, 2019 are hereby repealed.
- 33.21 Fire & Rescue Department. The City shall provide a Fire & Rescue Department for the benefit of its citizens, whose mission is to respond to fire, rescue, medical, hazardous material and other emergencies, to investigate the cause of fires, and to prevent fires and promote safety in the community. The department shall service the City of Emily and such surrounding areas as may contract with the City of Emily for services of the department.
 - (1) The Fire & Rescue Department shall be administered by a Fire & Rescue Chief.
 - (2) The Fire & Rescue Chief shall have subordinate officers to assist in management of Fire & Rescue Department duties and functions. The Fire & Rescue Department chain of command shall be defined in the Fire & Rescue Department Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). The Fire & Rescue Chief and the City Council shall develop administrative policies for determining qualified personnel which shall be submitted to the City Council for approval. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall recommend to the City Council appointment to Fire & Rescue Department officer positions.
 - (3) The Fire & Rescue Department shall have sufficient staff to respond to fires and other emergencies that may occur within the City. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall annually recommend to the City Council for consideration and approval by the City Council a staffing plan for the Fire & Rescue Department. The size and composition of the department shall be established by resolution of the City Council and may be changed from time to time by subsequent resolution and specified in the City's Personnel Policy. The compensation shall be included in the Wage Schedule Policy.
- 33.22 Fire & Rescue Chief. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall be appointed by the City Council taking into consideration recommendation of the members of the department. The Chief shall be responsible to the City Council for general policymaking and administrative control, budgeting, staffing, directing, evaluating, reporting, planning, and coordinating all activities of the Fire & Rescue Department, including, but not limited to, fire protection, emergency rescue, emergency medical services, fire prevention and safety educational services, training and safety of personnel, and fire station facilities, vehicles, and equipment assigned to the Fire & Rescue Department. Specific duties of the Fire & Rescue Chief shall be prescribed in a job description prepared and adopted by the City Council.

For Periods of absence from the City of up to sixty (60) days, the Fire & Rescue Chief shall appoint an Acting Chief. For periods of absence longer than sixty (60) days, the City Council shall approve the appointment of an Acting Chief.

33.23 Fire & Rescue Department SOPs. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall recommend to the City Council a set of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for operation and administration of the Fire & Rescue Department for consideration and approval by the City Council. The SOPs detail the organization and administration of the Fire Department and establish procedures for efficiently and effectively handling operations while maintaining sufficient flexibility to allow for deviation from the procedures when necessary.

33.24 Authority at Emergency Scenes.

- a. An emergency scene is under the authority of the first arriving emergency personnel, which includes Emergency Medical Services personnel/First Responders, until the arrival of the fire or law enforcement officials having jurisdiction.
- b. The Fire & Rescue Chief, or any Fire & Rescue officer or personnel in charge at the scene of a fire or other emergency involving the protection of life or property, shall have the authority to direct such operation as may be necessary to limit or mitigate the threat of injury to persons, or damage to property or the environment, extinguish or control any fire, perform any rescue operation, investigate the existence of suspected or reported fires, gas leaks or other hazardous conditions or situations or of taking any other action necessary in the reasonable performance of duty. In exercise of such power, the Fire & Rescue Chief or any other Fire & Rescue officer or personnel is authorized to prohibit any person, vehicle, vessel, aircraft, or thing from approaching the scene and is authorized to remove or cause to be removed, towed, or kept away from the scene any person, vehicle, vessel, aircraft, or thing which may impede or interfere with the operations of the Fire & Rescue Department. Any person violating this Section shall be guilty of an offense punishable as a misdemeanor.
- c. The Fire & Rescue Chief, or any Fire & Rescue officer or personnel in charge at the scene of an emergency, is authorized to place ropes, guards, barricades, or other obstructions across any street, highway, alley, place or private property in the vicinity of such operation so as to prevent accidents or interference with the lawful efforts of the Fire & Rescue Department to manage and/or control the situation.
- 33.25 <u>Investigation of Emergency Incidents</u>. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall investigate or cause to be investigated the cause, origin, and circumstances of fires occurring within the City pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 299F.
- 33.26 Mutual Aid. The Fire & Rescue Chief or his/her designee is authorized to respond to requests for mutual aid assistance in the form of Fire & Rescue Department resources from any political subdivision, agencies of the State of Minnesota, and Federal agencies, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 12, provided the emergency response needs of the City are not compromised, and the City Council or its designee is notified when Fire & Rescue Department personnel and/or resources shall be committed to the mutual aid response in excess of twelve (12) hours.

- 33.27 <u>Fire & Rescue Department Relief Association</u>. There is an Emily Firemen's Relief Association, whose function is to manage service pension benefits for Fire & Rescue personnel, authorized under Minnesota Statutes, and to provide other services to Fire & Rescue personnel of the Emily Fire & Rescue Department as deemed appropriate by members of the Association.
 - a. The affairs of the Relief Association are governed by its Bylaws. The Bylaws provide rules for matters such as membership, meetings, election and duties of officers and trustees, investments, eligibility for benefits, and benefit amounts.
 - b. Any proposed change to the Association's Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation which will affect the benefits paid from the Association's Fund shall not be effective until ratified by the City Council.

33.28 Fire & Rescue Service Definitions.

- a. "Service" means any deployment of Fire & Rescue personnel and/or equipment to extinguish a fire or perform any preventative measure in an effort to protect equipment, life, or property in an area of or threatened by fire. It also includes the deployment of Fire & Rescue personnel and/or equipment to provide fire suppression, rescue, extrication, and any other services related to fire and rescue as may occur.
- b. "Service fee" means the charge imposed by the City for receiving Fire & Rescue service.
- "Motor vehicle" means any self-propelled vehicle designed and manufactured to operate primarily upon public roads and highways, including semi trailers.
- 33.29 Service Fees. The City Council may, by resolution, establish fees for fire protection service and/or emergency response which are not otherwise specified by contract. Said fees may be established at a fixed rate for certain specific types of incidents or for actual costs incurred by the Fire & Rescue Department in responding to the incident. The Fire & Rescue Chief shall make a recommendation annually to the City Council for approval the fee to be charged for each service fee noted in this Section and such fees shall be specified in the City's Fee Schedule Ordinance.
 - a. Chemical/Hazardous Materials Spills. Fees incurred by the City for response to chemical spills on roadways, and at fixed private facilities within the City, or in other cities that personnel and equipment from the City may be requested to respond, will be charged to the owner of the chemical, the owner of the vehicle in which the chemical is being shipped, and/or to the owner of the facility where the spill occurred.
 - 1) Fees shall include, but shall not be limited to, actual costs for all personnel who respond to the incident for a minimum of one hour and the cost on a per hour basis for each piece of City apparatus and equipment that responds to the incident for a minimum of one hour. Vehicle and equipment costs shall conform to the most recent cost schedules published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency for disaster recovery, or in the event a piece of equipment is not listed on the schedule, it shall be billed at a reasonable rate to be determined by the City using industry standards.

- 2) In addition, the bill for service shall include any cost of clean-up of any contaminated equipment and/or repair of any equipment damaged during the incident or its replacement, along with replacement of any disposable equipment, supplies, and/or communication equipment, and administrative costs to be established at ten percent (10%) of the total bill.
- 3) Liens Upon Nonpayment. Each owner of the premises receiving Fire & Rescue Department service for a hazardous materials spill shall be deemed to have agreed to pay for said services and any delinquencies in the payment for the Fire & Rescue Department service to said premises shall be a lien and charged against the premises so served regardless of whether the same be a homestead or not.
- b. Wildland Fires. At the discretion of the Fire & Rescue Chief, fees may be charged to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for services provided for incidents under the jurisdiction of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.
- c. Arson, Accidents Due to Gross Negligence. Fees for services provided for incidents caused by arson or by gross negligence will be charged to the perpetrator(s) of the incident.
- d. Any party who receives fire service involving a motor vehicle accident or motor vehicle fire will pay for such fire service according to the schedule referenced above. Fire and rescue calls resulting from vehicular accidents on state and county highways, to the extent services are provided to non-resident individuals or non-resident businesses of the Fire & Rescue Department's area of service, will be charged to the non-resident individual or non-resident business.
- e. Impounding Vehicles/Property. The Fire & Rescue Chief or his/her designate is authorized to impound vehicles or property related to a fire and/or hazardous materials release and to be held in a secure location until such time as payment is received for Fire & Rescue Department response to the incident and/or the vehicle or property may be transported without further risk of injury to the public or damage to the environment.

33.30 <u>Billing and Collection</u>.

- a. A party receiving fire service will be billed directly by the City.
- b. Additionally, if the City is aware of the Insurance Company covering the involved vehicle, the City will send a copy of such billing directly to the Insurance Company.
- c. A party billed for fire service will have 30 days from the time of notice to pay, and if not paid by that time, it will be considered delinquent and an additional charge of 10% will be added to the amount due. Additionally, such party shall be liable for all collection costs incurred by the City including reasonable attorney fees and cost.
- d. If the fire service charge remains unpaid for 30 days after the notice of delinquency is sent, the City Council may also, on or before October 15 of each year, certify the unpaid fire service charge to the county auditor in which the recipient of the services owns real property for collection with property taxes. The county auditor is responsible for remitting to the City all charges collected on behalf of the City. The City must give the property owner notice of its intent to proceed in this manner by

September 15 of the year in which it certifies the unpaid charge to the appropriate county auditor.

- 33.31 <u>Hardship and Waiver of Fees</u>. When the City determines that imposition of a fee would impose an extreme economic hardship as determined by the City, the City may reduce or waive the fee as deemed appropriate by the City Council. Economic hardship may be established where a party is totally disabled and receiving social security benefits or railroad similar fixed income, retirement or disability benefits, and whose total household income is less than the annual low income level established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Low Income Level.
- 33.32 <u>Service Charge on Public Entity Property.</u>
 - (1) All property within the City owned by a public entity which is exempt from property taxation shall pay a service charge for emergency services rendered by the City on the public entity property, including fire, rescue, and medical services.
 - (2) The amount of such charges shall be:
 - (a) By agreement; or



RE: Emily Manganese Project Update - July 2024

In July, environmental visits associated with continued site reclamation (regrowth in disturbed areas) have continued. Plant growth and revegetation is accelerating with the Summer months, however, in association with the recent heavy rainfall a limited number of the reclaimed areas show erosional disturbance requiring some repair (recontouring in areas of 'gully washes'). The visits and the corresponding reclamation activities are in the planned activities by Barr Engineering, as approved by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Metallurgical testing and analysis of drilled samples continues to be assessed at the Kemetco Research Inc. laboratory, located in Richmond, British Columbia. The final flow sheet is still in optimization. The current Kemetco work is expected to be completed by this Summer.

North Star continued its discussions with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources on its mineral lease applications on certain State mineral lands in the Emily area. This activity will be on-going in 2024.
